Warwick Valley Prevention Coalition (WVPC) is a group of concerned citizens working to engage parents, youth and community partners in reducing the use of alcohol, marijuana and other drugs amongst minors in Warwick using evidence-based and promising practices and environmental strategies.

Our Mission: To encourage the Warwick Community residents to prevent substance use by creating a safer and healthier community.

Three Goals:

- 1. Increase community participation \mathcal{E} collaboration.
- 2. Reduce youth substance use.
- 3. Support prevention efforts in the school district by focusing on healthy lifestyle choices & skills.

WVPC is funded by the CDC's Drug Free Communities grant. The coalition has been a presence in the community since 2009.



Our coalition utilizes the Strategic Prevention Frame Work process to develop an action plan for the priority substances and misuse of prescription drugs. The plan is based on CADCA's 7 Strategies for Community Change which involves 1) Assessment 2) Capacity Building 3) Planning 4) Implementation 5) Evaluation. Following these steps has led to positive important changes in communities across orange county and New York as a whole. Our community assessment has shed a light on local conditions contributing to underage drinking and substance misuse here in Warwick.

High School (10th & 12th)


Alcohol- 54.9% Tobacco/ Vaping - 40.3% Marijuana- 33.1% Prescription Drugs- 4.9%

AVAILABILITY & FAVORABLE ATTITUDES:

Warwick students reported alcohol is easy to get, 49% say they drink at home. A youth focus group reported that 9 out of 13 youth say its very easy to get alcohol & other drugs in our community.
